PARISH MATTERS

The park has had the rotten trees removed, and thanks go to Roy Matthews and John Dearing for dealing with this. Thanks also to Roy for seeding the dog area. This will be opened in the near future and hopefully the weather will be better to us next winter.

The chairman and vice chairman met with the member for Thanet Highways to discuss 'slow' signs at either end of Spratling Street. We are waiting for a response.

The budget was confirmed for the year and the audit for 2017/2018 was passed by the internal auditor.

The deposit on a zip wire for the under 14's has been paid for installation in Manston Park. Hopefully this will be installed before the school summer holidays.

The clerk was given a cost of living payrise in line with regulations approved by all.

PLANNING—received for Manston Airport. The council discussed this and will be putting in a letter of objection. Cllr. Champs said there were too many empty properties in the towns that need returning to habitable use.

HIGHWAYS—Cllr Samme and Dearing have informed Highways where they would like the traffic counter in Flete Road. We are hoping for them to fit this shortly. Cllr Champs confirmed that closing the road may affect the emergency services.

Cllr Tritton advised that Manston Road junction by dragon roundabout – weeds are blocking the view from Lord of Manor. Clerk to contact Paul Valek. Preston Road near the village hall has sunk after previous work. This will be reported.

There is no further report on Portland in Flete Road.

MANSTON PARK— Hazel confirmed the grass has been cut, including the dog area. Swing seats are very dirty due to bird mess. We do not have water in the park, so it might be advisable if mothers take some wet wipes. The crests on the beacon need cleaning, and need new hinges. Cllr Tritton is unable to complete it as previously stated. Cllr Champs to look into it and see if he can find someone to do the work. He will report back at the next meeting.

We will be lighting the beacon in the park on 11th November to mark the 100th anniversary of the end of WW1. Further details later. We have instructed Climagate to carry out the repairs needed to the beacon. Cllr. Dolan is looking for someone to play the last post, and Roy Matthews knows of someone in the village who may be able to do this and will contact him.

Complaints were also received about the hedge in Spratling Lane being long and scratching cars when you have to pull in close. The owner will be asked to cut this as soon as possible.

The council agreed a co-chairmanship of Cllr Samme and Dearing for the next year.

NEW FUND RAISING PROJECT

Following recent guidelines from NHS England concerning the diagnosis of "one off" blood pressure readings and related blood pressure problems, it has been recommended that 24 hour monitoring would therefore enable a more accurate assessment and diagnosis to be made. We are therefore looking to purchase additional 24 hour blood pressure equipment for patients own use at home, at a cost of approximately £950 per 24 hour ABPM equipment.

SURGERY CLOSURE DAYS


Please note that the surgery will close at 12.00 Mid-day on the following days for the purpose of staff training: Thursday 28th June and Wednesday 18th July
